The staff made a nametag to put on the penguin nesting box. Eden and Ryan were really happy to be able to help a real penguin!

Geraldine told us that last year, the nesting box had two healthy chicks raised in it. This year, when Geraldine was checking the Penny Pohutukawa box, she found a pair of little blue penguins in it!
